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CoDA Texas Fellowship is spread clean across the state. From El Paso (far west) to Tyler (in the East) from Denton (north central texas) to McAllen (far south). All 7 Regions of Texas boast about their membership in CoDA . Where in Texas are our home meetings? (coast and north central)

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

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


Let's head northward to the hill country.

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
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Last leg of our travels....the eastern-most region, the Piney Woods

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

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
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Where, specifically, are our meetings?

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Beginnings: CoDA came to Texas in 1987 - 36 years.

Dallas group created a Handbook which prompted the forming of CORE Publications. today: delegates have developed info-presented to the state board, Intergroup reps and the Fellowship.

A cheat-doc similar to the old CliffNotes summarized and condensed a large amount of information in the proposed motions for Intergroup reps to peruse. An online survey was created to allow reps to voice their home meetings' feedback on motions. Webpages were revamped making them visually appealing and easier to access the tools and resources needed for recovery. Newsletters are posted online. 6 new meetings have been added during the year. As a result of these new meetings, a streamlined facilitators manual was created, online trainings were created for those new to CoDA service positions, and procedures in establishing new meetings was developed. An outreach program for Spanish speaking CoDA meetings was developed and supported by our intergroup reps as well as start-up fees for two, new, CoDA meetings. Several meetings have conducted inventories of their meetings. Surveys and voting online were utilized to spread the word and exercise voice. WhatsAp online social media has been a tool utilized by Texas groups to make connections with one another, to support one another's recovery efforts, and to share pertinent information. Newcomer meetings have been created separate from the regular meeting to address their unique needs. Studies of CoDA literature, twelve Step & twelve Tradition Studies are online, in-person, and ongoing. Adapting with Empathy & Support = Texas CoDA.
